

2020 Census



Your Response Matters.

A complete count in the 2020 Census is essential to make sure that communities don't miss out on needed funding. Alpine's response rate sits at 54.5% with the total Wyoming response rate of 59.9%. Idaho currently has the best response rate in the country @ 98.5%. We all need to log in and help our communities out by responding to the Census. It takes less than 5 minutes to complete. Please take the time and get involved today.

How does Alpine's new noxious weed ordinance affect YOU?

In order to maintain property values and protect the natural resources we recreate in, the Town of Alpine has passed 273 Ordinance No. 2020-02 Regulating Noxious Weeds. Please read the ordinance on the town website and call the town office if you have any questions. You can pick up a brochure at the town hall for a definition of noxious weeds, an explanation of the threats they pose, and a list of included species.

Starting in the summer of 2020 you will see town employees treating road easements and other town property with Milestone herbicide. Milestone will kill broad-leafed weeds (like spotted knapweed and thistle) without affecting grasses. Minimal amounts of Round-up (a non-selective herbicide) may also be used in cases where plants are growing in cracks in the asphalt and threatening the integrity of the road edge.

It is deemed safe for pets and people to walk through sprayed areas once these herbicides have dried on the plants.

If you have noxious weeds growing on YOUR property, you have the following options:

Personally remove the noxious weeds from your property. You can Contact the Alpine Noxious Weed Advisory Committee (ANWAC) at stoptheweeds@gmail.com for help with plant identification, control options, and to borrow a backpack sprayer and appropriate herbicide for chemical treatment.

Hire a private contractor to treat the noxious weeds on your property (list of businesses available at Town Hall)

NOTE: If you DO NOT want the Town of Alpine to spray the road easement bordering your property, you must keep it NOXIOUS WEED FREE.

For more information on noxious weeds, contact ANWAC and look for educational events that will take place in the near future.



Spotted knapweed is the invasive plant that is currently the biggest threat to property values and public land surrounding Alpine. Other invasive plants to look out for include Musk Thistle, Common Mullein, Hounds tongue, and Black Henbane.




Alpine Mountain Days / Alpine Car Show
